AGENDA APPROVAL: Norm P./Bob A. made the motion to approve the agenda, the motion passed.

MINUTES APPROVAL: Tom D./Harry B. moved that the minutes of August 2017 be approved with correction. The motion passed.

PRESIDENT’S REPORT: Pres Covalucci

- Vietnam Vets we receive recognition at a 50th Year Commemoration Luncheon, flyer will be added to website.
- On 1 Jan Kathryn Covalucci has volunteered to become the webmaster.
- For November’s Veteran’s day, will we do a float? After discussion, it was decided that “Yes” we will do a float and we’ll put in for a float permit. Bob Abney will take the lead in towing the float.

TREASURERS REPORT: Treasurer B. Abney reported:

- The Treasurer reported that the Total Unencumbered Net Worth of the Chapter was \$42,260.39
- So far, we have paid 8 of 11 Scholarships.
- Our CPA says we only need to retain records for 6 years. It was agreed that the Treasurer will destroy records older than 7 years.

A recommendation was made that maybe we should move the Secretary and Treasurer positions to move to off years from Presidential years, but since the slate is already set, it was agreed that we would take no action at this time.
- The Acting Webmaster led a discussion regarding request to include a new link on the website (link to a group that helps patients and Veterans diagnosed with asbestos illnesses). A motion was made (Joe P./Norm P.) to add the link, the motion passed with a caveat that we would add a disclaimer to the top of our Links Webpage stating that our Chapter is not "endorsing" any of these organizations, the links are provided for information purposes only.
- Terrie Gent led a discussion regarding using Constant Contact and/or the MOAA HQ Newsletter template as potential newsletter support services. Terrie gave an overview of both formats. Terrie G./Jan C. made a motion to use the MOAA preformatted newsletter, the motion passed. Terrie G./Norm P./Tom D. will be our Chapter's editorial team, they will organize the schedule of which of them is to be the editor for each month and will report to the Board at the next meeting regarding how the use of the new format went. Input for the October Heliogram is due to Terrie G. by Wed, 27 Sep.
- Terrie Gent was to lead a discussion regarding the sale of logo clothes to raise additional scholarship funds. This item was tabled in the interest of time (and to be added to next month's agenda).

SCHOLARSHIP: Dir J. Black reported:

AZ TRANSITION LIAISON/ESGR: Dir H. Bowen reported:

- **Jobs:** During the period of 15 August 2017 to 19 September 2017, we posted 10 Jobs plus several multiple listings for an additional 42 jobs. The multiple listings included engineering, analytical, dental, administrative, testing, and medical positions. Three of the positions were external to Arizona (Fort Meade Maryland, Aberdeen Maryland, and Natick MA).
- **Expos/Career Fairs:** During this period, we posted five (5) job fairs on the web site. We sent out one (1) notice yesterday for a job fair to be conducted today at the Cochise College which contained 21 companies with engineering, analytical, testing, medical, administrative, dental, and other jobs. This job fair provides a good cross pollination of white-collar and blue-collar positions. Attached to the minutes is a list of Employers attending the 20 Sep SV Job Fair.
- **Employer Support to the Guard and Reserves (ESGR):** We finally received the new Statements of Support for the Guard and Reserve endorsed by James Mattis, Secretary of Defense. We visited one company (Jacobs) and discussed the Employer Support to the Guard and Reserves and the purpose of the Statement of Support. We are to revisit and facilitate a signing session with the local Regional Vice President, James Woodard upon his return from travel back east. Now that Harry B. has the current SOS forms, he will revisit all of the Department of Defense Contractors and get them to re-sign a Statement of Support. He is still having difficulty convincing the younger Guard and Reserve personnel to nominate their employers for recognition for what they do. Because of this, Harry B. is now planning on hosting a Breakfast with the BOSS for just Defense Contractors. Current planning is for January 2018 after he gathers a few more contacts.
- **Cochise Serving Veterans (CSV) and the forthcoming Resource Fair:** There is no new word on the 501C(3) request from the IRS but a decision is not expected for at least another 30 days. The CSV Resource Fair was conducted on 18 August 2017 at the former Apache Middle School. We had 102 veterans and 5 family members (children) attend the fair. The good news was that one homeless member was able to obtain housing assistance through the Red Cross (not HUD/VASH due to his type of discharge). The exit briefings/questionnaires were very constructive and provided us with a better understanding of what additional services were

needed by our veteran population. They emphasized mental health, dental service, eye care/glasses, and more job opportunities. There were 56 registered providers (53 participated), 20 job educators and recruiters (with actual job openings) available (14 participated). This year, the hope was to have more than 9 Veterans leave with a job offer in hand (last year 9 Veterans left with a job offer). However, debriefs obtained indicate that the jobs were not suitable for the veterans who applied. There were too many white-collar jobs and not enough blue-collar (the vendor who had the blue-collar jobs did not show). We have placed special emphasis on improving this ratio next year. Five veterans did apply for financial assistance but the Social Services Support Committee was able to help two. Of the three that were not helped, two were denied because of conflicting information provided causing concern on the validity of the request. Funding was an issue with the last of the remaining three as the amount needed exceed our capabilities. We were able to get him in touch with another agency for support. The two that were helped were in jeopardy of being evicted and we were able to pay their penalties and/or utilities to keep them current and housed. Now that LTC Norm Patton is the Vice Chair of this committee, we hope to streamline the process and help more veterans more promptly as one of the veterans helped waited five days to get support and was within one day of eviction when we contacted the rental manager and paid the penalty.
