The Commissary

The new director of the De-

fense Commissary Agency (DeCA), William Moore, is a huge proponent of the

Commissary. He was the son of an Army E-8 whose family used the commissary and its benefits were extremely helpful. Moore, who was tapped to take over the DeCA in July 2020, said he is proud of this purposeful work and is dedicated to delivering the benefit and cost savings to the uniformed services community.

During the Covid-19 pandemic, the commissary system was quick to adopt safety, screening, and cleaning standards that provided confidence in the shopping experience. Some regions still struggled with shortages. DeCA's robust supply chain and inventory

process ensured goods continued to reach shelves, even with a shortage of some essentials early in the pandemic.

The administration's recent defense budget request to Congress included a commissary subsidy of over \$1.1 billion, on par with support in the past. In the effort to win back customers, DeCA will seek additional funding for manning and e-commerce programs to support a delivery option.

To guide these modernizations efforts, it's important DeCA receives feedback from commissary shoppers and military families. MOAA would like to know what you think about the current state of your commissary benefit:

"Sound Off" "Jody Calls"

The chant eventually evolved into what became Duckworth was a black Soldier from Sandersville, known as a Jody call. "Jody" was a fictitious character who steals a Soldier's sweetheart while he's away. He was the villain of many a short verse. For when he was drafted during World War II and asinstance, a popular version goes:

Ain't no use in goin' home.

Jody's got your gal and gone.

Sound off!

One, two!

Sound off!

Three, four!

What most do not know is that the chant originated in May 1944 at Fort Slocum, New York. Pvt. Willie Duckworth, a young soldier, noticed members of his

unit dragged their feet while marching. To pep them up, increase their energy, and keep them in step, he began calling this chant, thus, unknowingly cementing his place in U.S. military history.

and According to history, there was a spring in their step as troops responded to Duckworth's chant. This caught the attention of his commander. In 1944, a V-Disc (The "V" stands for "Victory.") recording credit-Familiar to all is the ca- ed Duckworth as the originator of the Sound Off or Duckworth Chant. This World War II-era record label, Sound off, 1-2; Sound used between 1943 and 1949, was created for American military personnel overseas.

> Georgia. He was raised by his grandparents in a sharecropper's house and was working in a sawmill signed to a provisional training center at Fort Slocum, N.Y.

> When, in 1952, the U.S. Army adopted The Army Goes Rolling Along as its service theme song, the lyric "count off the cadence loud and strong," was a reference to Duckworth's cadence. Upon his passing in 2004, the Georgia House of Representatives dedicated a portion of SR 242 in Washington County as the Willie Lee Duckworth Highway in his honor.
